Moving forward

The FOLLA committee are now fully focussed on the next stage which will be the legal acquisition of the canopy from the current owners, all of whom have indicated that they are in favour of the scheme. We have to get the legal niceties ironed out to the satisfaction of all parties. We are likely to seek a long term lease on the canopy with the current owners paying us a small annual maintenance fee.

By the way it is worth recording how grateful we all are to **Clear Law** whose solicitors (many of whom live locally) are giving their time and expertise free of charge to help us with all this legal work.


As for the actual restoration work, we have completed a detailed survey of the existing structure and are confident we're in a good position to oversee the work of our chosen contractor, **Select Interiors**. Select Interiors are playing a major role in the restoration work at The Parsonage in Didsbury and we have excellent reports of the standards being achieved there.

For the shop signage at the front of the canopy we will insist on an oval sign (just like the one in our logo above) hanging in each of the 20 bays across the 10 shop units.

The Bottom Line

As at July 20th we have:

- **501** signed up 'Friends'
- £6,240 in donations which with Gift Aid refunds from the Tax man should become **£7,916**
- We have applied for a total of **£19,500** in Grant funding from Manchester City Council (£16,000), Manchester Airport Community Trust Fund (£3,000) and United Utilities (£500)
- We estimate we need **£35,000** to complete the job
